ART & TEXT PROJECT Drawing Assessment

You should spend at least 1 hour on this task, you can use up to 1.5 hrs (2 lessons).

This task will be assessed to form your grade for assessment objective 3 (observational recording skills) for this project.

Tips

Before you start:

You will need a shading pencil (ideally a 2B, but a HB will do), a sharpener, an eraser and a ruler.

Select <u>one</u> of the following letters to draw.

Print the image in greyscale on A4 paper (you are to draw the image to scale).

Use a ruler to grid the image to ensure that your drawing is accurate (this is the same method that we used for the bug in the last project). Draw the exact same grid into your sketchbook (lightly, so that you can rub it out before you start shading).

The task:

Use the grid to carefully draw all of the outlines of the letter and tool.

Ensure that you have used a range of tones to convey form. The lightest tones should be on the letter, which contrasts to the darker tones you'll need to add to the tool. Make sure that you use the side of your pencil, in small movements to keep the shading accurate. Blend between tones.

Add highlights with a rubber.

For more advanced students- try to add any texture with appropriate marks.

Photograph and submit as a jpeg (for this don't use cam scanner as the image quality is really bad).

DRAWING LEVEL DESCRIPTORS

A1

The drawing is accurate and the perspective is correct.

The shapes are in proportion.

The shading shows a full range of tones, shaded in the direction of the form.

Some attempt has been made to show texture.

A2

The drawing is accurate.

The shapes are in proportion.

The shading shows a range of tones.

A3

The drawing is fairly accurate.

All shapes are in the correct position.

The shading shows only mid-tones.

B1

The drawing resembles the image or object.

The shapes are drawn with control.

There is no understanding of form.
